This secure link will allow you to complete the process.

A few important notes:

- This link is unique to Berrien County; if you are a volunteer in more than one county, please complete the check using the link from your primary county.
- There is no charge to you as a volunteer for these background checks.
- You will be asked to complete this simple process every year as long as you remain a volunteer.
- You can only use one unique email address per check (so a family sharing an email for 4-H Online would need to use separate emails for each volunteer completing this check).
- If you have previously completed your background check at this site and have forgotten your password please use the forgot password feature to have it reset. MSU Extension staff can not reset your password for this site.

If you need any assistance with the background check or would like to request a paper form, please contact the Berrien County MSU Extension Office at 269-927-5674. Please complete the background check by November 30, 2019 along with your 4-H Online reenrollment. If you still need to submit your annual background check please contact the Berrien County MSU Extension Office immediately!

On November 23, 2019, in collaboration with Berrien County Farm Bureau and Southwest Michigan Collegiate Farm Bureau, local Berrien County 4-H Clubs came together to participate in the Thanks 4 Giving community service project. Clubs were asked to provide items and assist in assembling baskets to give out to individuals and families in need throughout Berrien County during the Thanksgiving holiday.

Over 110 baskets were assembled and delivered to families. Each bushel basket was overflowing with enough food for a family to enjoy a

traditional Thanksgiving feast, including a turkey, locally grown lettuce, apples, potatoes, sweet potatoes, stuffing mix, canned vegetables, cranberry sauce, fresh baked dinner rolls, a pumpkin pie and vouchers for milk and butter from local grocery stores. Each basket contained at least 35 pounds of food and a total of 3,850 pounds of food was distributed!

There were over 60 4-H members, leaders and parents that assisted with assembling the baskets to help families across the county. Along with 17 Berrien County 4-H Clubs that participated in providing food for each of the baskets.

<u>2020 4-H Citizenship Washington Focus</u> participants learn about our nation's government by participating in hands-on leadership workshops and touring of historical sites in Washington, D.C. 4-H CWF is scheduled for June 20-27, 2020. Michigan 4-H CWF Participants will travel by charter bus to Washington D.C. visiting the 911 Memorial in PA and stopping overnight in Gettysburg, PA. While in Gettysburg, youth will visit the Gettysburg National Military Park Museum, travel the battlefields with a licensed tour guide and see the Gettysburg Cyclorama Map of the Civil War.

4-H CWF groups stay at the National 4-H Center just outside Washington D.C. and travel to all of the sites of the area including Mount Vernon, Arlington National Cemetery, U.S. Capitol, Iwo Jima Memorial, National Cathedral and the Holocaust Museum. Participants will also visit the Smithsonian Museums, Toby's Dinner Theatre, and the Armed Forces music program, Twilight Tattoo. Participants will tour the Capitol and meet with legislators and visit hearings on Capitol Hill Day.

4-H CWF participants join committees such as legislative and communications to help conduct the program. Participants also attend leadership workshops and work as a group to write and pass bills.

Michigan 4-H CWF is limited to 45 participants. Please contact your local MSU Extension Office if you are interested in attending the program. The cost of the 2020 4-H CWF program is \$1,500.00 which includes all meals (except 7 meals in transit), lodging and transportation.

Get ready for the 2020 4-H State Award applications process!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding

knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards (13-19 years old). The application process and selection is determined by the age of the 4-H member. Final candidates for the junior, senior and group level awards in each project area will be selected to participate in the State Awards program during 4-H Exploration Days in June where final selection and announcement of winners will take place.

The committee uses the essays to inform the public about what 4-H means to youth and copies are also shared with the Michigan State 4-H Office, Michigan 4-H Foundation, and Kettunen Center.

4-H Dog Patch Program



The Michigan 4-H Dog Patch Program is designed to recognize the personal achievements of individuals participating in the 4-H dog project area.

The program has been in existence since 1987 and provides youth with goals to work towards in this project area. There are numerous patches available to reflect the varying disciplines in which youth can participate. In 2019, three new patches have been added; the Rally Intermediate, Rally Master and Beginning Novice.
