Meet 4-H Tumbleweed Rider Leader Mary Stockel-Adams

Mary Stockel-Adams is another leader who has dedicated much of her life to serving 4-H. She was active in 4-H as a youth until she was 21 and has been a leader for 40 years!

"When I lived in Connecticut, our leaders were like neighbors. I come from a very big family, there are ten kids. So, my parents wanted to get us involved in something that would teach us things, so we got involved in 4-H. Our leaders lived down the road and I was able to take in a horse and my sisters and brothers were able to take in animals too," explained Mary.

Her dad decided to relocate, and she said the move was very difficult for her. "I was very involved in 4-H and the school FFA (Future Farmers of America). When she moved to Michigan, everything was brand new. "I was very shy." Two girls began talking with her and found out she had a horse and invited her to Tumbleweed Riders and that began a life-long dedicated relationship with 4-H.



"That's why it is so passionate to me because I think it made me who I am today," said Mary who eventually became a leader of the Tumbleweed Riders.

Crediting 4-H with her love of animals, she currently works at a Veterinary hospital as a vet tech. She was also Marshall High School's Equestrian Coach for 20 years. 4-H taught her the importance of volunteering so she gives her time to 4-H Council as well.

For anyone wondering if they should join 4-H, this is what being a member taught her:

Patience Honesty Truthful to being who you are Respect Leadership

As a youth, she often asked why are we doing things a certain way. "Now I realize why. So I can be here to support my family and friends, and help these youth to be stronger citizens, and have respect and leadership. Everything that 4-H provides.

4-H - All About Experiential Learning



4-H Clubs provide lots of opportunities to experience experiential learning. Experiential learning – or learning by doing – is at the core of what 4-H is about. Calhoun County is no different with clubs like Shooting Sports, Poultry Club, Companion Dog Club, as well as Creative and Expressive Arts.

Experiential learning happens outside of clubs, too. SPIN Clubs, or Special Interest Clubs, meet for six weeks and focus on a specific topic. While other programs, like the Tractor Operator Program, offer safety training, first aid skills and even driving experience to participants.

A few students and a teacher shared how this invaluable training changes the students' abilities and perspective on life.

Tavin Jones, 15, Marshall, said he enrolled in the Tractor Operator Program because it seemed like something fun to do and it turns out he was right. During they course they learned about safety, but what he liked best was the driving. Ivan Jackson ,16, Marshall, had exposure to tractors before, so he found the class easy. But the course reminded him of some of the challenges of driving a tractor, like being alert. He explained, "Watching out for stuff that might be in the way that you might think isn't in the way." Ivan believes he is a better operator now after taking the course and shared that all of it was fun.

Jeremy Blunt was the instructor for the course and said he has watched students communicate more and ask better questions with every lesson. He said, "They learn life skills of making good decisions and risk associated with it. They learn all the different components of a tractor and the risks associated with them. They learn how to drive in a confined space." The teenagers also developed more interpersonal skills and public presentation.

"As we go through class, I try to engage kids and keep them engaged so they step up, talk and answer questions, and get confidence. I asked them for volunteers to assist with this interview, and they would have never done that the first day."
