Hide 'N' Hares Spread Joy with Christmas Trees at The ARK (Association to Rescue Kritters)

I was so excited when I was able to help plan and participate in giving back to our community. So as a group we asked people to keep their real christmas trees for us to pick up and take them to the ARK. The A.R.K. or Association to Rescue Kritters, is a non-profit organization, that started in 2001, and is dedicated to the rescue. rehab, and release of native wildlife. The ARK said that the trees will be used to put in and around pens to be like their natural habitats and keep them warmer for the winter months and

so there is less stress while there and easier to readapt back to the wild. I first heard of the Ark when they brought in owls to our classroom and educated on the many ways wildlife gets hit by cars, or injured by other animals and even sometimes people, just to name some of the ways.They told us fun facts about the owls that day and how they can turn their heads in a full circle or they have very good night vision and are usually active at night. They told us about how long some of the recoveries can take, which takes many volunteers and lots of money and special diets and shelters.

I, and my club, hope to go back to the A.R.K. and help in any way possible. The A.R.K. does many events to help raise donations for the program. You can find more information about the ARK and their events and what they do at www.arkitters.org and on facebook.





Future Judges: Explore the pathway to becoming a future orchid judge.



- 2. All entries must be camera ready, on white paper.
- 3. All entries must be on 8 1/2 inch x 11 inch paper with one inch white border.
- 4. All entries must include the following information:
 - That this is the 141st Clare County Fair
 - That the dates of the fair are July 22-27, 2024
- 5. Each entry must have the applicant's name, age, address, phone number, and 4-H Club and/or school written on the **back**.
- 6. Entries should depict some phase of Clare County Agriculture and/or Fair Scenes and be the original work of the 4-H member or student.
- 7. The winner will have their artwork on the cover, receive a \$50 cash prize, and an armband for one day of midway rides. The three runners up will receive an armband for one day of midway rides as well.
