# Honor Club Credit Monthly Forms

#### What is the Honor Club System?

This is a way for your club to collect points over the 4-H year through a variety of ways. When clubs accumulate a certain amount of points they can rank in levels from bronze, silver and gold.

#### **Why Participate in Tracking Points?**

Clubs that level up to any of the 3 ranks are awards a monetary prize for the 4-H Council. Clubs may use this award in any way that benefits the club as a whole. Awarded in a gift card to the 4-H Club.

#### **Levels and Award Amounts**

Gold: 30+ Points Awarded \$75
 Silver: 20 - 29 Points Awarded \$50
 Bronze: 12 - 19 Points Awarded \$25

#### **How to Access the Honor Club Credit Forms**

The credit forms are available at the Clare County 4-H website. The Honor Clubs page is found in the menu bar. On a mobile device, you can extend the menu bar by selecting the tab at the bottom.

#### **How Do the Credit Forms Work?**

Clubs will need to designate one person to complete the form at the end of each month. Members, parents and other volunteers should inform this person of any types of credit they may have earned. The forms are separated by each month and submissions may be revised as needed up until August 31, which is the end of the 4-H year.

#### **Not Every Month is the Same**

It is recommended that you familiarize yourself with the different ways in which points may be earned. Each month has similar ways to accumulate points but there are some different opportunities available throughout the year.

#### Michigan 4-H Foundation Applications Open from April 1st in June 1st



#### Michigan 4-H Legacy Grants – 4 grants available for \$1,000 each

#### 4-H On-Target Grants – 3 grants available for \$500 each

Supports 4-H Shooting Sports programs to enhance existing programs, develop a new program or offer a special experience related to 4-H Shooting Sports. Funded with support from the Thomas H. Cobb 4-H Shooting Sports Endowment Fund and the Hal & Jean Glassen 4-H Shooting Sports Endowment Fund.

#### The Collins 4-H Youth Horticulture Grant – 1 grant available for \$500

This grant opportunity is for 4-H youth clubs only to advance club work in plant science and horticulture activities locally. This grant is made possible by the William J. and Ruth D. Collins Endowment Fund to advance 4-H youth horticulture and gardening programs.

#### 4-H Educational Garden Grants – 2 grants available for \$1,000 each

Supports the creation of local 4-H educational gardens in Michigan. Funded by the Albert A. Albright Endowment for support of 4-H Plant Science and Gardening Education.

# Michigan Farm Bureau (MFB) 4-H Excellence in Agriculture Award – 5 awards available for \$1,000 each

This award recognizes the outstanding agricultural 4-H volunteers that have exhibited excellence in 4-H youth education and leadership development in the areas of 4-H beef cattle; dairy cattle; goats; horses; horticulture, crops, and soils; poultry; rabbits; sheep; swine; and veterinary science. Honorees designate a \$1,000 grant to a 4-H agricultural program of their choice and are recognized by both Michigan 4-H and by Michigan Farm Bureau. Funded by the Michigan Farm Bureau 4-H Excellence in Agriculture Endowment Fund.

#### **Promote 4-H with the 4-H Creative Campaign Contest**

Youth ages 9-19 are invited to create short videos (under 60 seconds) promoting 4-H to their peers. Videos should address the question, "Why You Should Join 4-H!" Be a 4-H spokesperson by using your voice and sharing your 4-H story with others!

This contest is open to Michigan 4-H youth. Those not currently registered for 4-H can do so prior to entering this contest. The deadline for registration and video submissions is January 31, 2024.

A total of six prizes will be awarded to the top videos judged by professionals. There will be two age brackets for this competition:

- 4-H ages 9-13 (as of January 1, 2024)
- 4-H ages 14-19 (as of January 1, 2024)

Each age bracket will have three winners, who will receive the following prizes:

- First place prize: \$100 Amazon gift card
- Second place prize: \$75 Amazon gift card
- Third place prize: \$50 Amazon gift card
