## **Clinton County 4-H group travels** to national exhibition in Kentucky

Twenty-nine Clinton County 4-H dairy youth members and 18 adults traveled to the North American International Livestock Exhibition (NAILE) in Louisville, Ky., Nov. 4-7.

While there, the Clinton County senior guiz bowl team competed in the NAILE national guiz bowl competition. The team earned an invitation to participate in the contest by winning first place at 4-H Dairy Days held in July at MSU.

Team members traveling to Louisville were Kristine Batora. Kayle Jakus, Janelle McClelland and Allison Pung. Katie Thelen traveled with the team, but was unable to compete since she competed at the national level previously.

Seventeen teams competed in the national quiz bowl championship.

Clinton County lost its first round to Wisconsin, the eventual winner overall. The team won its next two rounds before being narrowly defeated in the third round by Illinois.

In addition to taking part in the quiz bowl contest, participants had a chance to watch the national




