MSU Ag Tech students prepare for 2019 trip to Europe

Students will be raffling off MSU Spartan hope chest, auctioning handcrafted end tables, to raise money for the once-in-a-lifetime trip

Six Michigan State University (MSU) Institute of Agricultural Technology (Ag Tech) dairy cattle judging competitors will be traveling to Europe from June 19 to July 3, 2019. The students qualified for the trip by earning a second place finish overall in the 2018 World Dairy Expo **Post-Secondary Dairy Cattle Judging** Contest in Madison, Wis., in October. The students who will be going on the two-week trip to Europe are: Gerrit Baker of Byron Center, Kristen Burkhardt of Fowlerville. Miriah Dershem of St. Johns, Rebeka McDonald of Conklin, Lynn Olthof of Ferrysburg, and Elyse Zimmerlee of Olivet.

Team members will be selling raffle tickets for a chance to win a handcrafted MSU Spartans-themed hope chest to raise money for the trip to Europe. The chest is constructed of cherry wood and measures 39 inches wide by 25 inches deep and stands 25 inches tall. A foam-padded cushion adorns the top of the chest, and there is an interior sliding drawer.

Raffle tickets cost \$5 each or five tickets for \$20. The winning raffle ticket will be selected on July 18 at 8 p.m. following the 4-H Dairy Days awards presentation at the MSU Pavilion for Agriculture and Livestock

Education. One need not be present to win. The second place ticket will receive a \$100 cash prize. Tickets can be purchased from any of the Ag Tech judging team members or by sending an email to Burkhardt at burkha88@msu.edu.

The team will also be auctioning off two MSU Spartans end tables during the Great Lakes Regional Dairy Conference (GLRDC) in February in Frankenmuth. These two handcrafted pieces are also made from cherry wood and each feature a black ceramic MSU Spartans tile in the middle of the table.

In addition to the raffle and auction items, the team members are accepting donations to fund this once-in-a-lifetime educational opportunity. The group will be exploring Scotland and Ireland, touring London, and they will also have a chance to visit European dairy facilities, compete in the Royal Highland Show, and network with dairy industry leaders from around the world.


