Ken enjoyed coming to the Gladwin County Fair & seeing the youth involved, especially in the horse area. Ken was always working with his hands and loved helping others.

The scholarship is to provide an award to Gladwin High School and Beaverton High School graduating high school seniors for the purpose of attending an accredited post-secondary educational institution. The successful applicant will be a current and actively enrolled the student in the Gladwin County 4-H program and will have been enrolled for at least 5 years.

Eligibility

Applicant must:

- Be a current member enrolled in the Gladwin County 4-H program.
- Have been actively enrolled in a 4-H club for at least the last 5 years.
- Be a Beaverton High School senior, Gladwin High School senior, Skeels Christian Senior, homeschool senior or College student still eligible for 4-H.
- Be planning to attend an accredited post-secondary educational school or vocational school.

Applicants may apply more than once, but can only receive one grant.

Scholarship Information

Two scholarships will be awarded to Gladwin County 4-H Members. These will be awarded at parents' night in Beaverton, the Honors Assembly in Gladwin, or the Skeels Christian Honors Program. If you are home-schooled, your award will be presented at one of the three above assemblies.
