Join the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase!

MSU Extension is thrilled to partner again in 2023 with the <u>Michigan State Fair</u> on an exciting program for Michigan youth: the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase. This statewide showcase provides a virtual platform for youth across Michigan to exhibit their work in all project areas and apply for up to \$10,000 in scholarships. Any Michigan youth ages 5-19 is encouraged to participate; 4-H membership is not required.

Registration for this event is now open! The diverse array of classes celebrate all the projects and programs in which youth have developed skill and mastery. This includes livestock and animal showmanship classes, as well as still exhibits, educational projects and more.



There is no cost to participate and youth may engage in as many classes as they wish by <u>submitting project photos and videos</u>. **Be sure to submit your entries by the registration deadline of August 1.** Project evaluation will occur before the start of the Michigan State Fair so that winners can be announced at the event which occurs August 31 – September 4.

In addition to the opportunity to showcase their skills, recognize their accomplishments and receive constructive feedback for growth and development, participants in the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase will also have the opportunity to apply for \$10,000 in scholarships. Going home: Biosecurity tips for animals that went to the county fair

<u>Michigan State University Extension</u> offers these biosecurity steps exhibitors can take to protect their show animals and those that were left at home after the fair has ended.

- Keep animals that were at the fair separate from animals that were not for 28 30 days. If at all possible, do not allow nose-to-nose contact and provide as much distance between animals.
- Disinfect all buckets, feeders, tools and footwear that was at the fair.
- Throw away any feed or hay that was at the fair.
- Always wear clean clothes and footwear. Boot coverings may be helpful when caring for animals.
- Take care of animals that stayed home from the show first, and animals that were at the show second. Do not go back and forth between animals as this increases the risk of cross-contamination.
- · Do not eat or drink in the barn.
- Observe animals daily for signs and symptoms of illness, such as:
 - Obvious pain or discomfort
 - Decrease in appetite and water intake
 - Fever
 - Lethargy
 - · Diarrhea or changes in consistency in manure
 - · Discharge from nasal cavity or eyes
 - · Overall weakness

Care of animals after the fair is just as critical as their before-fair care. Exhibited animals were exposed to new animal populations and fair goers, and most likely experienced a lot of stress during their time away from the farm. By practicing these biosecurity steps, you can help keep all of your animals safe and healthy.

1. REGISTRATION/OFFICE HOURS:

Friday: 5:00-6:30PM ONLY for exhibitors entering classes #1-19. Friday: 6:30-9:00PM for ALL entries Saturday: 7AM through end of show

- CLASS FEES: \$7 per class. Sweepstakes class \$10.
 Sweepstakes: Minimum 4 entries, no ribbons, 25% 1st Place, 15% 2nd Place & 10% 3rd Place.
- GYMKHANA JACKPOT: \$12 fee per rider per show. Best overall time for each event wins share of pot. Pot is split evenly for Cloverleaf, Indiana Flag Race, Key Hole, Figure 8 Stakes, Pole Bending and Speed & Action classes.
- STALL/TACK STALL FEE: \$40 per show. No reservations will be taken. ALL STALLS MUST BE STRIPPED!! \$20 refund after stall check. PLEASE PUT MANURE IN SPREADER and TRASH IN GARBAGE CANS.
- 5. **TRAILER-IN FEE** (showing from trailer): **\$10** per horse/per day
- TRAILER PARKING: All trailers not being used for overnight camping MUST BE PARKED in NON-camping areas, in trailer parking areas. DO NOT park trailers in camping.
- Please clean up around your trailer. As a courtesy to others, leave the grounds as clean as when you arrived.
- CAMPING: \$25/Night. Campsites will be available first come, first served. Camping arrivals after 3PM on Friday and departure by 11PM on Saturday or an additional day will be charged. Any vehicle, trailer or camper in a camp site will be charged for electrical use/camping. Payment for camping at time of registration.
- 9. 4-H RULES APPLY— No Stallions
- JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL. All concerns can be filed at registration office.
- 11. NO REFUNDS for registered classes.
- 12. Back number is 1 Horse/1 Rider combination
- 13. Exhibitor's age as of January 1st of the current year.
- Rider/horse combination in W/T classes is not to ride in W/T/C classes.
- 15. Adult Classes: Show Clothes are optional.
- 16. A current year Negative Coggins Test is required.
- 5-7 year olds must adhere to the 4-H Cloverbud guidelines.
 All 5-7 year olds must wear ASTM/SEI approved helmet.
- 18. Exhibitor must show in age appropriate group.
- 19. Ponies must ride in age Division.
- 20. No Novice Horses in 12 & Under classes.
- Lunch breaks to be announced. Food concessions will be available.
- 22. Entries close 2 classes preceding class entering ring.

- 23. The Committee has the right to split, combine or cancel classes and to break all High Point ties.
- 24. A responsible adult must be on grounds at all times horse is on site.
- No electric fans or appliances (other than trimmers) to be connected to outlets in barn. Battery operated fans are acceptable.
- The Committee has the right to eliminate tack stalls if necessary.
- Stalls are to be stripped within 1 1/2 hours after completion
 of last classes on Saturday and all horses out of the barn.
 Barn will be closed and locked 1 1/2 hours after last classes.
- 28. Aisles, including center aisle, must be kept clear.
- 29. Miniature Horse (38 inches and under) and Small Ponies (38-46 inches) are eligible for Mini classes.
- 30. Payment by cash or check only.
