
Plant-Microbe Interactions CSS 460, 3 Credit Hours

- Explore how microbes interact with each other and their environment in plant-associated microbiomes.

- Apply current knowledge of plants and microbes to formulate testable hypotheses.
- Evaluate data and create conclusions using data-based evidence.
