PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

With well over 15,000 golf courses in the United States, there is a demand for technically trained personnel to provide management for them. Training in the Turfgrass Management with a golf course emphasis is directed toward preparing the student for a career as a golf course superintendent.

This 18-month technical training program consists of two 15-week semesters and two 10-week semesters, for a total of 54 credits. A certificate is granted at the completion of the program requirements.



CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The increasing recognition that University-level trained graduates in this field are available, together with the excellent performances by many of the graduates, has resulted in high demand, and more job opportunities available each year than there are graduates. Starting salaries range from \$25,000 to \$45,000 and the entry point ranges from senior crew member to assistant superintendent or even superintendent depending upon experience.





ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A high school diploma with at least a 2.50 GPA in traditional subjects (Math, English, Science, History) is required. ACT or SAT scores are not required but are useful due to the large number of applicants. Applications will be reviewed, the middle of February each year, for acceptance on a monthly basis or until the class is filled. To ensure careful consideration students are encouraged to return their application as soon as possible.
