It has been three years since we held our last in person annual meeting. Covid restrictions began in March of 2020 and the annual meeting that year was cancelled. Restrictions continued through 2021 and last year's annual meeting was held virtually on March 23, 2021. But this year, we will gather together again for the annual meeting on April 7th, 11:00-3:00 ET, at Bay College in Escanaba.

As you can imagine, the attendance for last year's annual meeting was low, so just pertinent business was conducted. The treasurer's report was presented and approved, the Livestock and Agronomy research priorities were discussed and approved with no changes, and Ike McTyver was accepted to receive the 2021 Service to Agriculture Award posthumously. Since it is very difficult to conduct elections virtually, the membership voted to extend the current terms of the board members and officers for two years.

It seems like profit margins are historically low for agricultural products, especially if you live in remote areas far from normal commodity markets as experienced here in the UP. Finding a niche, adding value to the product, and selling locally is one avenue available to increase those profit margins. However, marketing value-added products can be very challenging and, at times, daunting for most producers. During the afternoon session of the annual meeting, a panel of producers will share their experiences and insights into "Local Foods-Marketing at the Next Level".

RESEARCH PRIORITIES

The Growing U.P. Agricultural Association strives to provide direction and support collaborative efforts to share resources through the agriculture industry in the Upper Peninsula. The GUPAA board and research advisory committee reviewed and revised the Project GREEEN Agronomy and Livestock Priorities for the UP which are listed below.

Top Agronomy Priorities

- 1. Promote the integration of regenerative crop and livestock systems that are climate resilient.
- 2. Investigate, develop and demonstrate methods to improve soil health and soil biology.
- 3. Evaluate cost-effective methods to maintain or increase the economic viability of forage production in the UP on various soil types.
- 4. Continue to investigate and develop other potential cash crop production and marketing strategies.

Top Livestock Priorities

- 1. Promote the integration of regenerative crop and livestock systems that are climate resilient.
- 2. Investigate programs that add value to UP produced livestock and dairy products.
- 3. Utilize the beef herd at the Upper Peninsula Research and Extension Center to enhance research capabilities.
- 4. Support resources to enhance small and/or beginning farm development and sustainability.

GUPAA members will have the opportunity to discuss and ratify these lists of priorities at this year's annual meeting.
