





No more paper tickets. No more load reports. Get paid faster.




## Mills

# The cost factors in harvesting

## Here is an incomplete list

- Who owns it, what kind of sale
- How far is it from the logger's home
- Is it one job, or a series of jobs
- Ground conditions
- How far is it from the major markets
- Who will pay for road improvements, maint., plowing
- What species of trees, product mix, # of sorts
- What is the average piece size? Handcut/ctl?
- Does the market want this mix of wood?
- How complex is the harvest prescription?
- Marked wood or operator select, thinning or cc
- What is the harvest timeline expectation?
- Terrain, skid distance, season, vol/ac, vol/job,
- Forestry work completed?
- Insurance requirements
- Buyers contract with the mill...
- Apps developed by MFPC to get into the weeds
- "Day rate models" equipment mix

# The cost factors in hauling

## Here is an incomplete list

- Who owns the truck? How many do they have?
- Who pays the truck?
- What are the expectations of the truck?
- How far does the trucker live from the job?
- What are the road conditions? Miles and time, wear and tear
- Will he need to be pushed out regularly? Tire chains required?
- Terrain, crib or truck and pup, loading and unloading?
- Is the payer reasonable?
- How steady is the work?
- How many sorts and how far from the mills?
- How much can they make per hour? Per day?
- How much down time will there be?


So many factors determine your woods value
