Sweat Scraper

REMOVES SWEAT AND WATER FROM THE HORSES BODY

CLEANS HOOFS

Body Brush

HELPS TO SHORTEN A HORSES MAINE AND TAIL

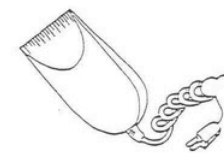
Clippers

CUTS OFF LONG HAIR FROM LEGS, MUZZLE, AND EARS



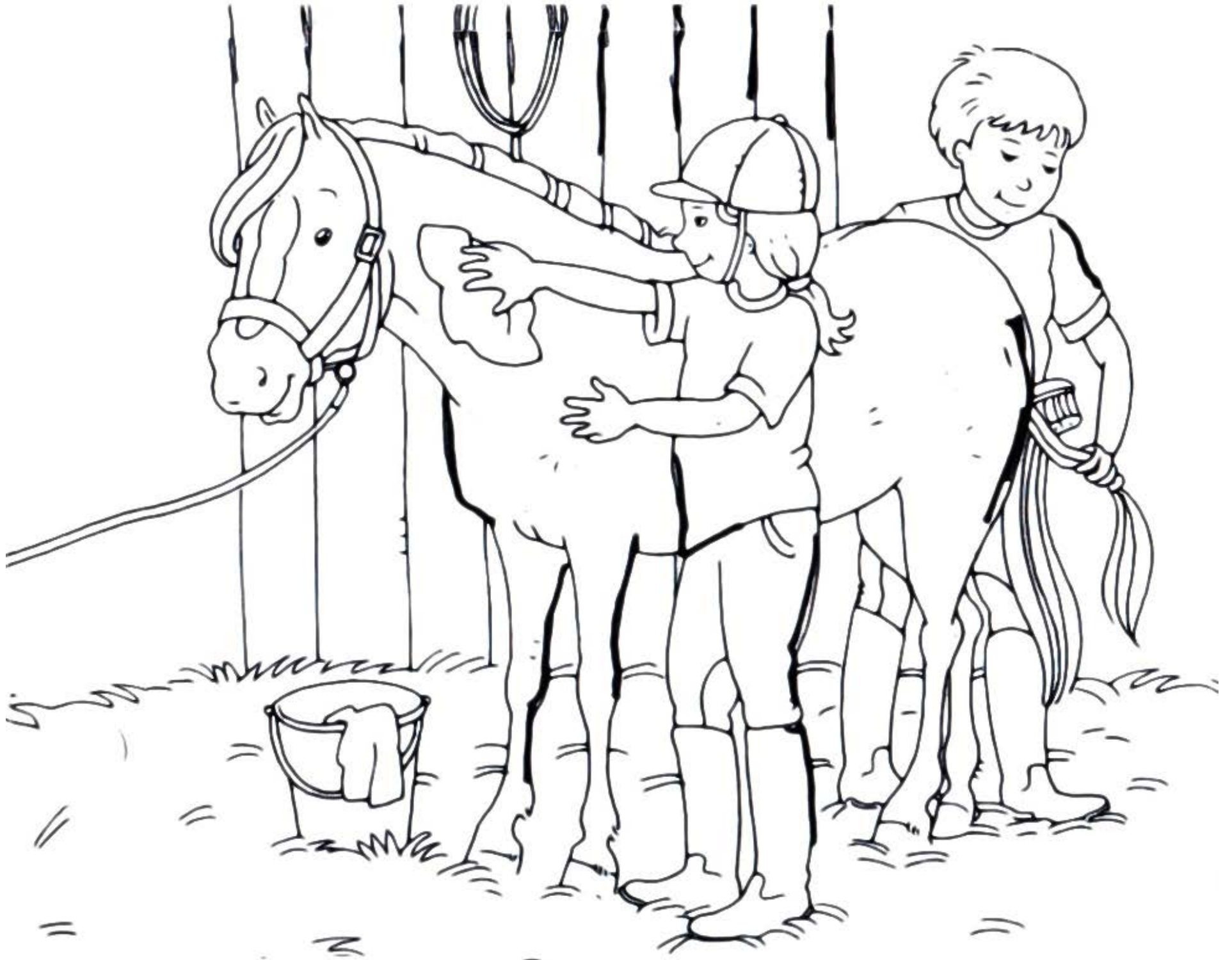
SHEDDING COMB

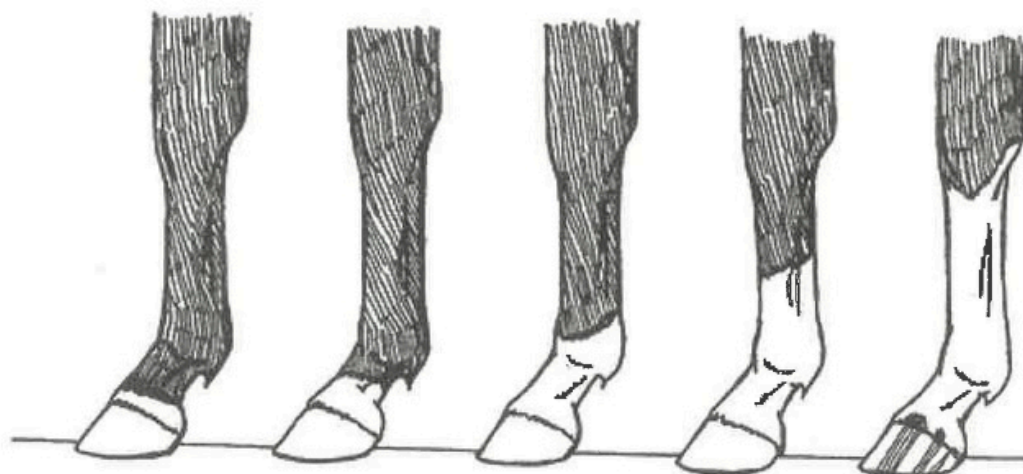
