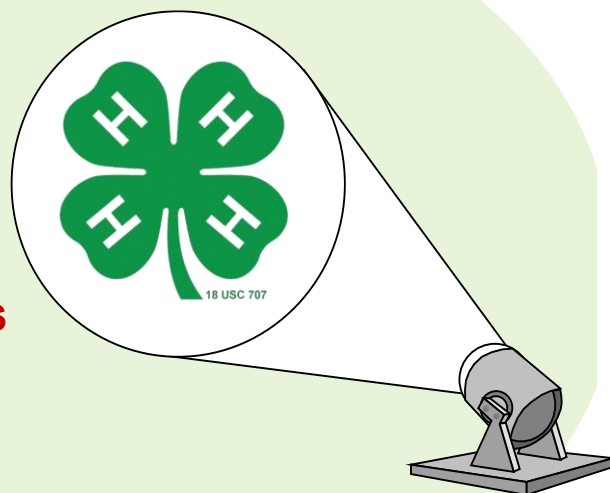

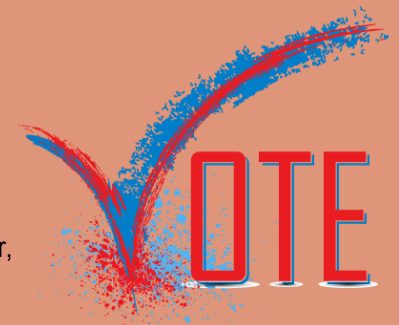
Leaders Council 2024 Elections

- 1 Turkey
- 1 Package of dinner rolls

- 1- 3 lb bag of potatoes

- 1- 14 oz. can of cranberries sauce

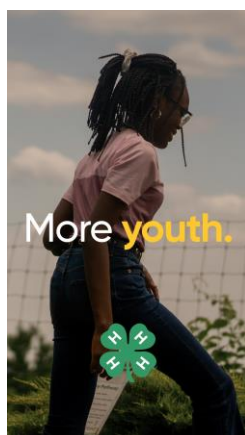

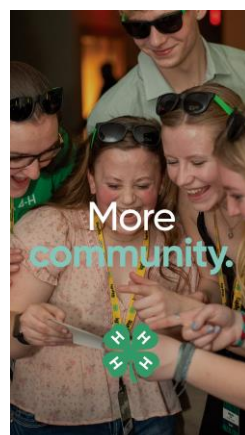

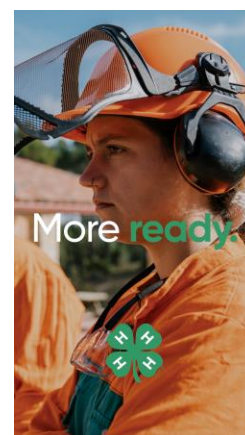
