 - 5. Project Photographs
 - 6. Marketing Plan and Sale Reflection (Only animals being sold)
 - 7. Judge's Comments

- Must be submitted to the MSU Extension Building for judging by 12:00pm (noon) on Tuesday of Fair week.
- Winners will be announced Fair week, however, awards will be presented during the 4-H Fall Awards Ceremony.
- Note: Each year keep the pages from this record book in a binder as this is a progressive project record book and should illustrate the knowledge you have gained oved the years in your project area. Record Books can be picked up from the MSU Extension Office after judging takes place.
