### PAR Report - Kathryn Fitzpatrick



Our final yield was 2662 lbs. of vegetables, including a generous donation of 509 lbs. of pumpkins left over from the Pumpkinfest. Both edible and gourd pumpkins were provided to Forgotten Harvest, Northville Civic Concerns, and PB&J. One final task in October, was planting the garlic saved from our harvest for this purpose, as well as a new cultivar from Johnny's Seeds, German Extra Hardy. We will compare the yield and quality of each to see if we need to invest in new seed garlic for 2027.

The garden was winterized with all beds weeded and covered with black plastic, thanks to the wonderful PAR Garden team, as well as CSA volunteers and staff – thank you!

We now turn our attention to planning for 2026; based on our successes and challenges in 2025. Each



crop will be reviewed, and new cultivars or different crops will be considered. The garden layout will include crop rotation. A list of seeds and equipment needed will be developed and a budget established. And finally, a 2026 season plan will be drafted, including the late winter / early spring work in the greenhouse to start our transplants.

### **NURSERY NOTES - Peg Palmer**

The Nursery is CLOSED until next Spring! After the last bustle of activity to cut back and place mulch in all the pots, the Nursery Team gets to take a break, but there is still planning and prep work during the winter months.

All our Nursery plants are "Michigan Hardy," but some varieties struggle in a pot during a Michigan winter. We try to provide more insulation by grouping pots closely together and surrounding them with mulch. This helps to insulate pots somewhat to the constant cycle of warmer days, often with rain, followed by much colder, snowy days... it is a challenging environment for plant roots trapped in a plastic pot! We always plan for more plant donations in the Spring, since some winter losses are inevitable. During these dull winter days, think about the plants you may have to donate to the Nursery in next Spring!

### Monkshood: Last plant blooming!



Aconitum napellus, Monkshood, is a beautiful late season bloomer that is one of the last blooms seen in the Tollgate Demonstration garden for the season. This 3-foot tall perennial with deep purple blooms is showy but it has a dark side worthy of notation. All parts of the plant, especially the roots and seeds, are extremely poisonous to humans and animals if ingested. Gardeners should take care to avoid skin or oral contact with plant juices, as well as using gloves when handling the plant. It is advisable to be particularly careful to cover up any open cuts or skin abrasions prior to entering garden areas where Aconitum has been planted. Aconitum (Aconite, Blue rocket, Devil's helmet, Helmet Flower, Leopard's bane, Monkshood, Queen of poisons, Wolfsbane, Woman's bane).
