Show Your Sportsmanship

Sportsmanship is more important than winning or losing; than any individual accomplishment you will earn all year. How you react when you win (with humility) and when you lose (with grace) is what will define you. All of your hard work can be undone in one moment of poor sportsmanship.

OF THE MEMBER-SHOWMAN . . .

- *Accept and understand the seriousness of your responsibility, and the privilege of representing your club, family, and community.*
- *Live up to the standards of sportsmanship established by 4-H and your club.*
- *Learn the rules of showing thoroughly and discuss them with parents, spectators, and fellow showmen. This will assist both them and you in the achievement of a better understanding and appreciation of showing.*
- *Treat competitors the way you would like to be treated, as a guest or friend. Who better than you can understand the hard work and team effort that is required of showing?*
- *Refrain from taunting, trash talking or making any kind of derogatory remarks to or about your competitors, judges, or show committee.*
- *Wish opponents good luck before classes and congratulate them in a sincere manner following either success or setback.*
- *Respect the integrity and judgment of the judge and show committee. The judges and show committees are doing their best to help promote you and showing in our county. Treating them with respect, even if you disagree with their judgment, will only make a positive impression of you, your club, and 4-H in the eyes of the judges and all others at the event.*
- *Remember that there is a difference between gamesmanship and sportsmanship. Sportsmanship demands that we not try to push the limits of the rules to gain an advantage in competition*
- *.Be an exemplary role model at the trailer and in the show and practice arenas.*
