HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN THE WORLD FOOD PRIZE MICHIGAN YOUTH INSTITUTE



Using the World Food Prize Foundation's <u>Global</u>
<u>Challenge Paper Instructions</u>, youth select a
country and research a pressing challenge in that
country related to global food security,
agriculture, and sustainability.

Each participant writes a three to five page paper outlining their research findings, as well as their ideas for addressing the global challenge in their country of choice.

Teachers and adult mentors who would like to attend the Institute with their student(s) must also register by March 15, 2025.

There is no registration cost to participate in the Institute and meals will be provided at the event, however, students and teachers/mentors must organize their own transportation to the event.

4-H State Awards 2025

The commitment you put into "**Making Your Best Better**" is significant. Through your 4-H experiences you are molding your future by growing your skills, becoming a leader, and serving your community. Your 4-H journey has required curiosity, determination, accountability, and dedication to learning and growth. Your efforts are commendable and deserve to be recognized with a Michigan 4-H State Award, the highest honor bestowed on a 4-H member.

The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program is a hands-on learning experience that allows 4-H members to develop and practice "adulting" skills such as resume writing, filling out an application, and interviewing. Applications and interviews are based on communicating your 4-H participation and learning experiences. Applicants are eligible to compete for cash prizes and be recognized for their 4-H involvement. 4-H members who meet the minimum application score are eligible for a \$50 scholarship toward their 4-H Exploration Days registration. The 2025 Michigan 4-H State Awards will be presented during the 4-H Exploration Days on June 18 at MSU.

Hosting Details

- Mid-July to Mid-August 2025
- Youth from Costa Rica, Japan, Korea, and Taiwan
 - * Exact dates dependent on your state. Please check with your state's Coordinator for details.
- Host a youth aged 12-18 (majority are 12-14) or an adult chaperone
- Youth have a range of English language abilities, so host families should be prepared to communicate imaginatively
- This is a voluntary program; no stipends will be provided

Host Family Requirements

- You must have a child of the same gender who is within 3 years of the hosted youth (children aged 9+ are eligible to host)
- Families without children of the appropriate age may host an adult chaperone
- No special activities need to be planned since these youth want to experience American culture, make new friends, and improve their English by staying with your family
