Month	Farm Produce
September	Cherry Tomatoes
October	Broccoli / Cauliflower *
	Apples - MI Apple Crunch!
November	Winter Squash - various e.g., acorn, butternut, spaghetti squash
December	Carrots
January	Kohlrabi *
February	Cherries - MI Cherry Slurp!
March	Honey – served with plain yogurt and dried MI cherries
April	Parsnips (TBD) or shoots / sprouts *
Мау	Spinach or Asparagus
