Applicants will submit a letter of application to Benzie County 4-H Youth Development. The letter of application must include:

- a. Three (3) references.
- b. Letter of Acceptance from the college or trade school considering attending.
- c. Reasons why the applicant feels consideration for the scholarship is warranted and be written in the student's own words.
- d. The students' involvement with 4-H, FFA, and community service will be a significant factor in awarding the scholarship so attention to content and presentation will be very important.

Letter of Application Reflection Prompts

- Describe your future plans and goals.
- What are three strengths that you possess and three challenges you have had to overcome. How has 4-H and/or FFA helped you to improve upon your strengths and work on the challenges that you have faced?
- What District, Regional, State, or National 4-H and/or FFA programs have you attended? Share your learning experiences at each.
- What are two meaningful things you did in 4-H and/or FFA that helped you become the person you are today or directly impacted your academic or vocational goals/path?
- Describe your service to your community outside of 4-H and/or FFA.
- How will this scholarship help you reach your goals?
- Describe your financial need.

Qualifications to Apply:

- 1. Must graduate in the current year of the scholarship award.
- 2. Must be a current Michigan 4-H or FFA member.*
- 3. Must have a grade point average greater than a 2.5, qualify for financial aid, and have a genuine need for financial assistance.
- 4. Applicants must have been accepted by a college or trade school in an agriculture-related field.
- 5. A letter of application, including three (3) references, a copy of Letter of Acceptance from the college(s) or trade school(s) considered for attendance, submitted to Benzie County 4-H Youth Development by April 30.
- 6. One \$300 scholarship will be awarded per year, until the fund is depleted (unless additional donations are made to continue to the fund).
- Scholarship will be awarded based on the completion of the narrative application only, the impact
 4-H has made on the youth's life, and the demonstration of financial need.

* Preference will be given to students from Benzie County or surrounding counties.
