### U.S. Breweries

- 1612: First known brewery at New Amsterdam
- 1810: 132 breweries
- 1850: 431 breweries
- 1860: 1,269 breweries
- 1861: IRS is created
- 1862: \$1 per bbl. excise tax, USBA formed
- 1867: 3,700 breweries
- 1873: 4,131 breweries High water mark

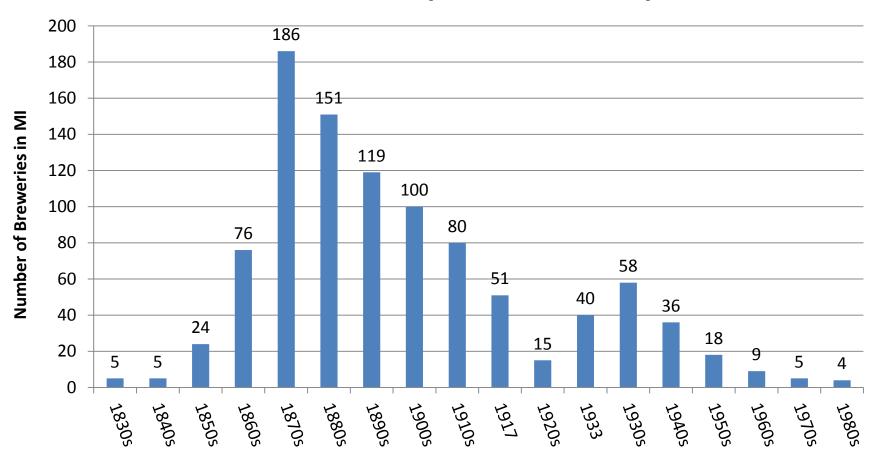


### U.S. Breweries

- 1880-1910: number of breweries declines
- 1910: approximately 1,500 breweries
- 1920-1932: Prohibition
- 1934: 756 breweries
- 1950: 407 breweries
- 1961: 230 breweries owned by 140 companies
- 1983: 80 breweries owned by 51 companies
  - Top 6 produce 92% of beer
  - Low water mark

# Historical Growth & Decline of Michigan Breweries (1830s - 1980s)



### U.S. Breweries Return

- 1969: Fritz Maytag purchases Anchor Brewing Company
- 1977: Jack McAuliffe opens New Albion Brewing Co.
- 1980: Ken Grossman opens Sierra Nevada Brewing Co.
- 1982: Bert Grant opens first brewery/restaurant –
  Yakima Brewing & Malting Company
- 1984: Micro breweries begin to spread
- 1990: Sierra Nevada Brewing Co. produces 31,000 bbls.
- 1994: 84 microbreweries & brewpubs in CA
  - = More than entire US in 10 years prior
- 1995: 500 breweries

# 1850-1873: 25 Years (roughly)

- Breweries flourish in US
  - 1850: 431 breweries
  - 1873: 4,131 Peak number pre-prohibition



# 1880-1910: 25 Years (roughly)

- Breweries decline in number in US
  - 1873: 4,131 Peak number pre-prohibition
  - 1910: About 1,500 breweries
  - Period of competition, efficiency & consolidation



# 1920-1933 Prohibition





# 1934-1983: 50 Years (roughly)

- Breweries decline in number in US
  - 1934: Post Prohibition surge
  - 1950: 407 breweries
  - 1961: 230 breweries (140 companies)
  - 1983: 80 breweries (51 companies)
    - Top 6 brewers account for 92% of production



### 1980-2005: 25 Years

- 1980: 92 breweries
- 1985: 110 breweries
- 1990: 284 breweries
- 1995: 800 breweries
- 2000: more than 1,500 breweries
- 2005: just under 1,500 breweries



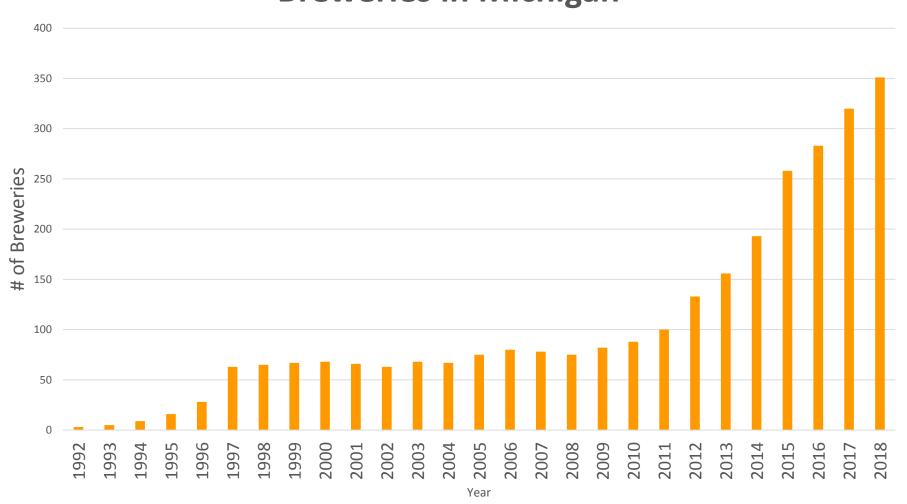
### 2005-2030 25 Years

- 2005: Just under 1,500 breweries
- 2010: More than 1,800 breweries
- 2015: More than 4,500 breweries
  - New high water mark
- 2018: More than 7,000 breweries

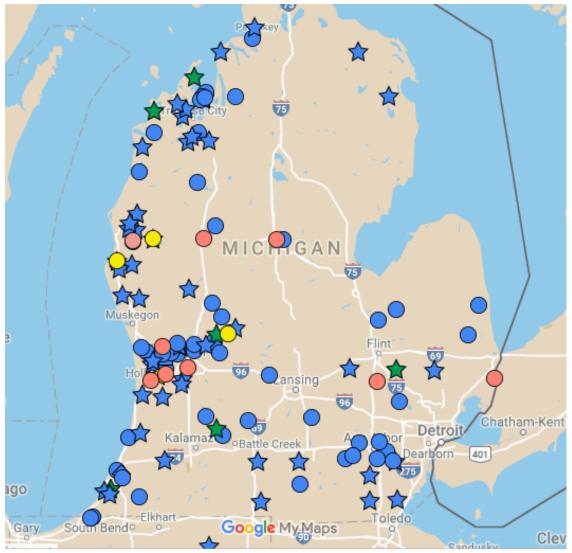






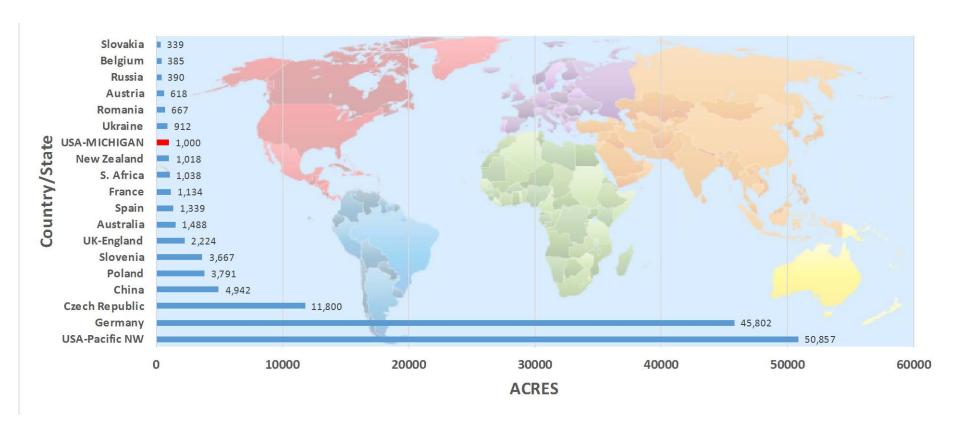






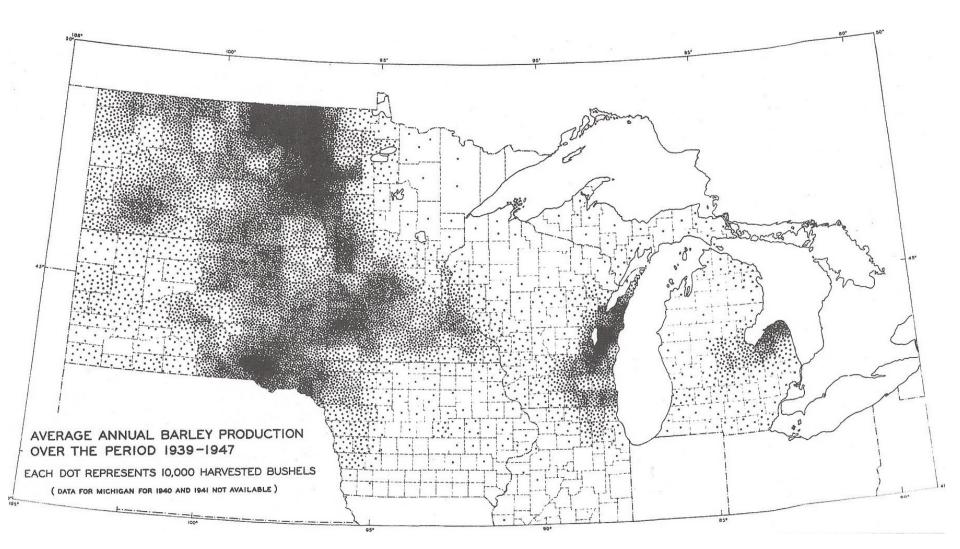


#### 2016 Global Hop Acreage



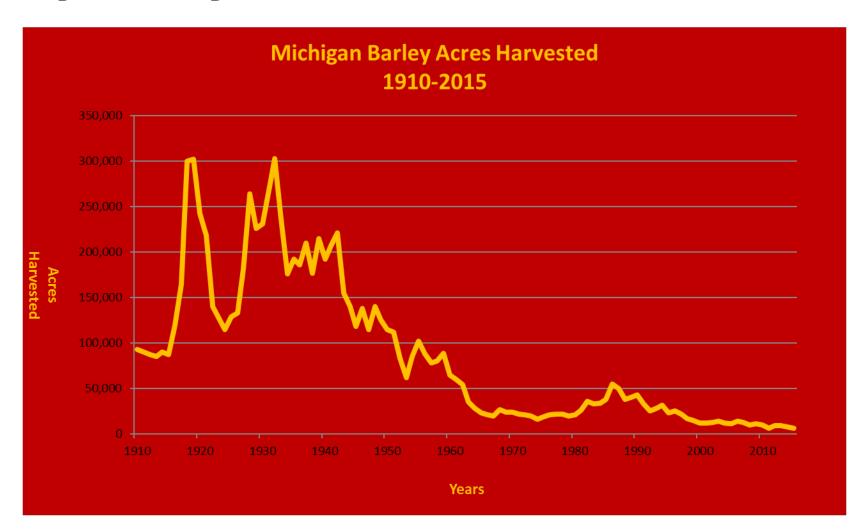


### **Average Annual Barley Production**





#### **Michigan Barley Harvests**



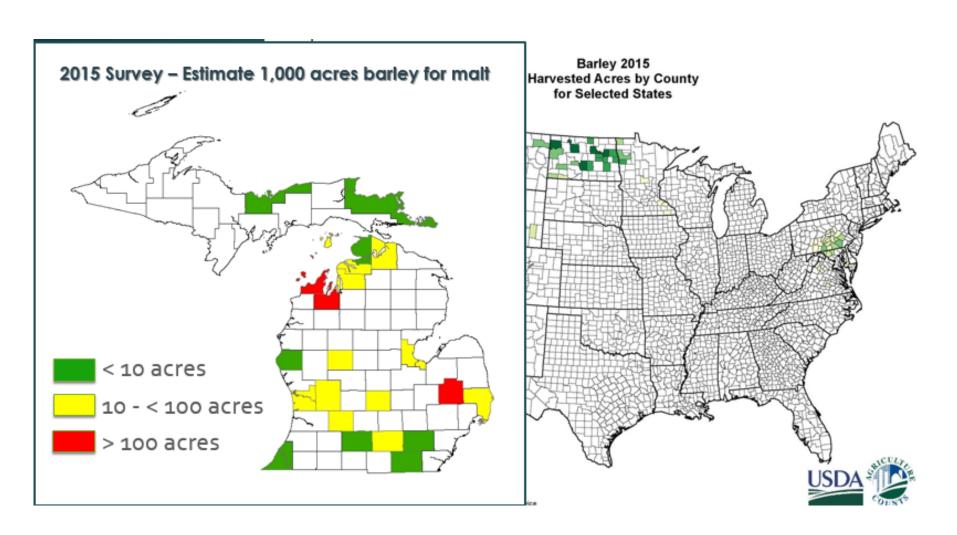
