This residence was hidden behind a mass spruce with little character. After the garden renovation, the stunning architecture was revealed and the landscape began to harmonize with the surrounding native terrain.

Located on the south side of Buttermilk Ski Resort, the project consisted of a complete remodel. The existing landscaping had minimal planting, a small water feature, and a lawn. Much of the garden was native scrub.

The client's wish was to create an outdoor oasis where they could entertain guests, walk in privacy, and enjoy the sounds and vistas of the surrounding, natural landscape.







# ENTIRE LANDSCAPE Location: Aspen, CO Project Status: 2016-Current Scope of Work: Design · Install · Maintain





The original water feature was small and hidden behind pine trees. By enlarging the pond and adding intentional tiers for depth, we created a layout for a floating water garden. A tumbling water fall was installed adjacent to the existing pathway to bring calming sounds of flowing water into the landscape. Stone was installed to bring an earthy, natural aesthetic to the lawn, cohesive with the surrounding environment.


Wildflower fields were installed below and along the entrance approaching the residence. Gardens were installed at the front, around the pond, and along a newly installed flagstone, woodland path that leads into the wildflower field. While these areas were disjointed before the project, through careful plant selection and placement, the property began to become one harmonious and cohesive space for entertainment, privacy, and tranquility.














Beautiful stone pathways lead you through this enticing landscape with water features on either side. Leading down to native wildflowers beds, the landscape creates a sense of serenity.

Located at the end of a long, exposed street, this resident expressed concern over drivers being able to see directly into their house. By placing curvature on the driveway and planting tall gardens in front of the windows, FLD was able to successfully screen out the house from the roadside. Hedges of dappled willow and flame willow was employed to accomplish this. Russian sage and lilac were interspersed to bring vibrancy and color to the landscape pallet. A row of catmint was installed to accentuate the lacy features of the willow. The owner, being from Virginia, had expressed a desire to bring some elements of home into her Colorado landscape. A driveway apron and skirt was installed using bluestone pavers. This simple addition brought in a coastal element to blend in with the Colorado identity.










Tucked away on McClain Flats, this residence has been carefully maintained for over 10 years by FLD. Mass planting of Russian Sage, Shasta Daisies, Monarda, and Zauchernaria create a pop of color and variety, while blending seamlessly into the native backdrop of Red Mountain. These mass plantings create a dramatic look with their boldness.








The Ute Place Complex required one of their three ponds be replaced. This 256,000-gallon pond had a leak that was compromising one of the neighboring residences. Fitzgerald was contracted to remove and replace the existing water feature and upper spill way pond with a modern waterproof retention system. FLD also removed and replaced the decorative dry stone walls and enhanced the feature with locally sourced rock and stone to naturally filter the new pond and provide a visually pleasing finish.





This residence is secluded in the woods. along Faraway road. The intent was to create a striking landscape for a mountain home with dramatic views of the surrounding valley, while still maintaining the privacy of its cool woodland setting. The client desired a landscape that would better integrate their residence with its natural surroundings. The water feature along the wall is one of the main focal points of the area. The falling waters lap along black beach pebbles in a multitiered system.








The multiple levels are visually tied together with terraced planting and a simple, yet striking, water feature, while a "floating" steel and stone staircase physically connects the space. Glass railings are incorporated throughout the project to eliminate visual barriers and the surrounding views and natural hillside.

The built elements are designed to lie softly on the land, allowing all natural features to dominate. The planting palette includes native grasses, native and adaptive perennials, and shade trees to create a pleasant micro-climate throughout the space. The plants provide refined texture, subtle color, and gentle playfulness throughout the season.

An award-winning Wall Street Journal House of the Day, this Missouri Heights residence has breath taking views of Mt Sopris. The water feature was designed to create a stream flowing through the house. Due to the intense sun in the area. drought tolerant plants were used to minimize water usage. The lush purples compliment the wood stain and rustic steel paneling that wrap around the exterior of the house. When the large double-doors are opened, the sound of the water percolates through the house.


