WORKSHOP 1 DESCRIPTION:

Amaze Your Friends With Magic- Come and learn several easy magic tricks that will amaze your friends and family.

Launch into Science-Get ready to build, launch & learn! Participants will dive into hands-on STEM challenges – including designing & testing their very own marshmallow catapult. From creative problem solving to engineering fun, this session will spark curiosity & teamwork while showing how science & innovation come to life!

Broom Ball- Learn the skill and techniques to broom ball. Have fun outdoors on the ice challenge your coordination and teamwork to score the most goals!

Crafts Around the World: North America -Enjoy and be introduced to a simple cultural traditional craft from North America. We will learn how to make the simple craft of "Guatemalan Worry Dolls" and having fun creating as we learn about the culture and the country.

Art Explorers: Fun and Easy Crafts- A hands-on session using basic tools to create and personalize leather goods like bracelets, book markers, and coasters and craft a dazzling suncatcher using pony beads and crystals for an instant touch of sparkle wherever it hangs.

Ice Dyeing- Discover the science behind stunning, and surprising, designs when colors split. You'll explore how melting ice and dye interact, creating vibrant patterns while learning about chemistry and color theory in action. This session blends art and science for a colorful experiment you can wear or share!

WORKSHOP 2& 3 DESCRIPTION:

Cat Curiosity- Ever wanted to learn about cat showmanship? Fun facts about our fancy furry friends? Want to pet one up close and personal? Well, here's your chance! Join us for 4-H related activities and information regarding cat showmanship at the county fair level. We will have hands-on demonstrations and even have a live cat to examine. Please be allergy aware!!

Lego Science- Use Legos to answer science questions such as: Can you building a hurricane-proof building? How do wrecking balls work? and How many Lego can you balance off one brick?

Paper to Pulp- Get creative from start to finish! In this session you will make your own paper, design a custom journal & learn simple journaling techniques. Have fun, reflect, create & express yourself one page at a time!

Stop Motion Animation-Bring your ideas to life by transforming everyday objects into exciting stories. You'll design, snap, and edit your own stop motion mini movies using creativity and digital tools. This session combines science, technology, and creativity to show how innovation moves—literally—frame by frame!

It's a Wrap! Jewelry wire wrapping-Enjoy and be introduced to the art of jewelry wire wrapping. You will learn the basics and wrap special stones of Michigan, creating necklaces, keychains, or whatever your creative minds discover and make.


Mandatory reporting guidelines for Michigan 4-H volunteers

MSU Extension has updated its mandatory reporting guidelines (www.canr.msu.edu/od/civil_rights_diversity_multiculturalism/civil_rights_compliance) to align with MSU's policy (UW-02-01). All volunteers are required to report incidents of child abuse, neglect, or misconduct promptly. Reports should be made to MSU's Office for Civil Rights (MSU OCR) and, when applicable, to Children's Protective Services (CPS)/Department of Health and Human Services. In short, volunteers should:

- 1. In emergencies: Call 911 immediately.
- 2. Child abuse/neglect: Call CPS at 855-444-3911 and file <u>DHS-3200</u> (available at <u>www.michigan.gov/mdhhs/adult-child-serv/abuse-neglect/childrens/mandated-reporters) within 72 hours.</u>
- 3. All other incidents: Report to MSU OCR via online form at https://msu.guardianconduct.com/incident-reporting/; phone at (517) 353-3922 between the hours of 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. and 1:00-5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday; by mail at 408 W. Circle Dr., Suite 105, Olds Hall, East Lansing, MI 48824; or by email at ocr.isr@msu.edu.
- 4. Please notify your local MSU Extension staff after submitting a report.

Coordinator's Corner - December 2025

November is a month that always makes me pause and reflect on the many blessings in my life. I'm thankful for my family who encourages me, my wonderful friends who support me, and the job I am truly passionate about—coordinating 4-H in this amazing county. Every day, I get to work with youth, volunteers, families, and community partners who care deeply about helping young people grow. It is an honor to serve in a role where I witness confidence being built, sparks being discovered, and leadership taking shape.

One thing I want to highlight this month is the importance of youth voice. Our young people are not just participants—they are leaders who deserve to be heard. Their ideas, experiences, and perspectives matter. 4-H Council is one of the strongest places for teens to use their voice and help shape the future of Isabella County 4-H. If teens want to make the best even better, this is where they can do so. We understand that teens are busy with sports and school activities, and all we ask for is communication. We will always work with you. After all, 4-H is about YOUth, and the more voices we have at the table, the stronger our program becomes.

This month also brought exciting conversations about expanding youth opportunities. Michigan 4-H offers statewide experiences that help youth grow, explore new interests, and build lifelong skills. One of these is 4-H Capitol Experience, open to youth in 9th grade through age 19. Participants do not need to be current 4-H members, but they will enroll in 4-H Online after registration. Youth select an issue group based on their interests, which is led by teen facilitators and provides opportunities to meet peers from across the state and discuss meaningful topics. Throughout the experience, youth meet elected officials, hear from policy experts in a variety of fields, learn from young changemakers, and explore issues important to Michigan youth.

Youth ages 8-12 year olds may also enjoy attending 4-H Winterfest, a two-day overnight camp at Eagle Village focused on teamwork, hands-on learning, and exploring new project areas. Participants engage in interactive sessions, learn how to take their personal best and make it better, build positive relationships with adults and peers, develop important life skills, and gain personal independence and confidence in trying new things.

I also want to take a moment to highlight how important our Tractor Supply Clover Campaign funds and our Isabella County 4-H Endowment Fund are to this community. These funds directly support youth scholarships and help cover costs for statewide experiences like Capitol Experience, Exploration Days, and Winterfest. If you ever worry that your family may not be able to afford one of these opportunities, please know that you are not alone—and that is exactly why these funds exist. We never want finances to be the reason a young person misses out on life-changing experiences. These funds help ensure that every youth has the chance to explore, learn, and grow, no matter their situation.

These statewide programs offer youth unique chances to learn, lead, and discover their passions. They help young people grow into confident, capable leaders who are ready to take on new challenges. As we move into the holiday season, I want to thank each member of our 4-H community—youth, parents, volunteers, and partners—for your support, your enthusiasm, and your dedication to making Isabella County 4-H a place where young people truly thrive. I am grateful for everything we have accomplished together, and I look forward to all we will continue to build in the months ahead. Happy holidays!
