Register for Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience!

At Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience, teens learn how to change the world for the better through engagement in Michigan's state government and public policy process. The program is scheduled for March 15-17, in Lansing.

The three-day event, open to high-school-aged youth, includes tours of the Michigan Capitol, interactions with state legislators, meetings with state agency staff, lobbyists and state-level experts and learning how policy is made. During the program, youth work in small teams to draft legislation on: agriculture; civil rights and youth advocacy; crime and law enforcement; education and teacher retention; environment and natural resources; health; and jobs, the economy and infrastructure.

Apply for the Michigan 4-H State Awards!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 10 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H and develop their career skills by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence contest (10-11 years), junior state award (12-15 years), senior state award (16-19 years) and group awards (13-19 years). An Achievement Award was added last year for 18-19-year-olds. Each application and selection process varies, dependent on the applicant's age.

Coordinator's Corner – January 2026

Happy New Year, 4-H families!

As we welcome 2026, I can't help but feel excited about all the opportunities ahead for our Isabella County 4-H youth. A new year brings fresh energy, new goals, and so many meaningful experiences for our members to grow, lead, and discover their spark.

This year is packed with incredible statewide and county events including 4-H Capitol Experience, Winterfest, Exploration Days, and more. These programs allow youth to explore career interests, build leadership skills, meet peers from across Michigan, and see firsthand how their voices can make a difference.

One event I am especially excited about this year is our AI in Agriculture Series. When many people hear "artificial intelligence," there is often concern about AI taking over jobs or replacing people. In agriculture, however, AI is being used as a powerful tool to support farmers, not replace them. Today, farmers use AI for robotic milking systems, monitoring herd health, improving feed efficiency, and detecting animal health concerns earlier than ever before. These technologies help farmers make better, data-driven decisions while still relying on the knowledge, care, and problem-solving skills that only people can provide. For our youth, this opens the door to exciting career pathways in agriculture, technology, engineering, animal science, data analysis, and farm management. Through 4-H projects and hands-on learning, youth can explore how innovation connects to real-world farming and how they can be part of shaping the future of agriculture.

One important reminder as you look at these opportunities: cost should never be a barrier. Thanks to the incredible support of our community, local sponsors, and donors through efforts like the Tractor Supply Clover Campaign and our county endowment fund, we are able to cover a minimum of 50% of participation fees for every 4-H'er interested in attending events such as Capitol Experience, Winterfest, and Exploration Days. If you have ever thought, *"That sounds amazing, but I'm not sure we can afford it,"* please reach out—we are here to help.

2026 is shaping up to be an exciting year for Isabella County 4-H, and I look forward to seeing our youth step outside their comfort zones, try new things, and continue becoming Beyond Ready for whatever comes next.
