It is time for us to start forming our county wide animal science teams! We are offering three programs this year: Hippology, Horse Judging, and Livestock Judging! The Hippology team studies all things horses - from feed & nutrition, to breed identification, tack, and more! The Horse Judging team places you into the role of judge! The Livestock Judging team will focus on judging Beef, Swine, Sheep, and Market goats, but will learn important skills and knowledge for all species, as well as how to explain your reasoning.

#### Run for an Officer Position on a Livingston County 4-H Committee

We need more 4-H youth to use their voices and shape our program at our Livingston County 4-H Committee meetings! This is YOUR 4-H program, and we encourage 4-H members run for officer positions on committees relevant to their projects and interests.

Our Livingston County 4-H Committees include 4-H Animal Project, Council, Grand Equestrians, and Horse. Youth interested must be enrolled 4-H members prior to being elected. Adults interested in serving on a committee must be Gold level volunteers prior to being elected. If you are interested in running for an elected position on any of the following committees, please contact Kat VanDouser, krollkat@msu.edu.



The requirements for youth and adult officers for each committees are included below:

- 4-H Horse Committee will hold their elections in November, and youth must be 4-H age 9 19 years old to be eligible for an officer position.
- 4-H Animal Project will hold their elections in October, and youth must be 4-H age 9 19 years old and enrolled in an animal project to be eligible for an officer position.
- 4-H Council will hold their elections in November, and youth must be 4-H age 14-19 years old to be eligible for an officer position. 4-H Gold Level volunteers must have 2 years of volunteer service to be eligible for an officer position.
- Grand Equestrians will hold their elections in November and older 4-H teens who have volunteered with the program are eligible to sit on the committee as members.
