Volunteer at Blake's, learn, and earn money for your club

In collaboration with Macomb County 4-H, Blake's Orchard & Cider Mill is offering a fantastic volunteer program for 4-H youth members on Saturdays and Sundays through November 2, 2025. Volunteers will interact with farm animals, learn about animal care, and assist with various activities at the orchard, gaining hands-on experience in a fun and welcoming farm setting. From helping care for animals to engaging with visitors, this program offers a great way to build skills and gain experience in agriculture. As a thank you, Blake's Orchard will make a donation of \$10 per person/hour worked to go back to their 4-H club.

Choose a morning shift (10 a.m.- 1 p.m.) or an afternoon shift (3-6 p.m.). The volunteer commitment is three hours per shift.

Responsibilities for volunteers include:

Animal Care:

- Replenish water in animal enclosures
- Feed animals according to provided guidelines
- Brush animals and help maintain their hygiene
- Assist with cleaning pens or arranging bedding

Guest Interaction:

- Communicate with visitors about the animals, their breeds, and their care
- Teach guests interesting facts about the animals (information will be provided beforehand for preparation)
- Help with farm operations, ensuring visitors follow safety protocols

Volunteers will:

- Follow all guidelines set forth by both 4-H Macomb County and Blake's Orchard.
- Be respectful of animals, guests, and the farm staff.
- Commit to their selected shifts and notify the farm in advance if they are unable to attend

Blake's will:

- Provide farm staff to supervise and mentor the volunteers, ensuring a safe and educational environment. Staff will not be alone with a volunteer (minor) in an isolated or private space.
- Provide all necessary training for the volunteers, including animal safety and proper care.
- Ensure that all volunteers follow safety protocols when interacting with the animals and guests.
- Provide the necessary materials, such as feeding tools, brushes, and safety gear.
- Provide clear communication channels with 4-H Macomb County for reporting issues, concerns, or updates.
- Request feedback from the 4-H volunteers about their experiences at the end of each month. Feedback will be used to help improve future programs.


4-H Youth Archery October 7-December 16

4-H Thriving Model of Positive Youth Development


Why 4-H? This is a question asked many times of our youth and adults. What made you want to get involved and what keeps you coming back?
