Madyson has been active locally in the Armada Fair in many project areas, earning Grand Best of Show and Best of Show. She has also competed nationally in dog shows, earning #1 Cavalier Junior & #10 Toy Group Junior ranks, including 263 defeats!

Annual Financial Summary Reports

Each 4-H club and committee is required to submit an <u>Annual Financial Summary Report</u> (AFSR) at the end of each program year (Sept. 1-August 31).

There are NEW Annual Financial Summary Report forms this year — one for clubs **with funds**, and one for clubs **with no funds**. Leaders may either fill the form out electronically or use a printed copy. Leaders of SPIN clubs with funds need to submit a 4-H SPIN Club Record of Finances instead of an Annual Financial Summary Report. 2025-2026 4-H Enrollment

Club Enrollment: Club enrollment packets not picked up at the Armada Fair for new and returning 4-H club leaders have been mailed. The information is also available on our web page and has been emailed to administrative club leaders.

Member Enrollment/Re-enrollment: The 4-H Online enrollment system will reopen on September 8th for 2025-2026 Member and Cloverbud enrollment or re-enrollment.

Volunteer Enrollment: New volunteers need to apply and complete the Volunteer Selection Process through <u>Volunteer Central</u> and be interviewed by a Macomb County 4-H Program Coordinator, then enroll in <u>4-H Online</u>. Returning screened volunteers should only need to re-enroll through <u>4-H Online</u>. If other action is needed of a returning volunteer, a Macomb County 4-H Program Coordinator will contact the volunteer. Volunteers and volunteer applicants may check their status in <u>Volunteer Central</u> at any time, or contact the Macomb County 4-H staff.

Food safety is key to successfully selling honey and maple syrup in Michigan. Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development allows for collection and production of honey and maple syrup that can be sold without a license, and there is an expectation that this is done safely. Personal hygiene, food safe containers, storage, cleaning and sanitizing methods, and MDARD's exemption guidelines are topics covered on this workshop.

Preserving MI Harvest - Three Sisters-Preserving Corn, Squash and Beans

The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program is open to 4-H members who are 12-19 years old with two or more years of 4-H experience. To qualify, 4-H'ers must submit a written application that showcases the learning experiences, knowledge and skills they've acquired through 4-H, as well as their contributions to 4-H communities. Submissions are reviewed by a selection committee. In addition to a plaque, each 4-H State Award winner in the senior division received a \$300 cash award, junior winners received \$100 cash awards, and achievement award winner received \$500. These awards are made possible by generous donations to the Michigan 4-H Foundation.
