Specialty Crop Block Grant Program





- Enhances the competitiveness of specialty crops.
 - fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture and nursery crops (including floriculture)
- Funding comes to Michigan from the Farm Bill

Specialty Crop Block Grant Program



Eligibility

- Non-Profit and For-Profit entities
- Local, State, Federal and Tribal Governments
- Colleges and Universities (non primary)

Funds **cannot** benefit a single organization, institution or individual.



Specialty Crop Block Grant Program



Goals and Objectives

- Enhance the marketability and competitiveness of specialty crops
- Expand access to health and safe Michigan grown specialty crops
- Expand stewardship practices, natural resource conservation and the development of ecosystem services
- Ensure the viability of Michigan specialty crops by investing in the next generation of operators

Specialty Crop Block Grant Program



Project Examples

- A non-profit requests funding to contract with a university to conduct research on the feasibility of planting, cultivating and growing a specialty crop in a particular area; results of which can be shared with many growers throughout the state.
- A non-profit organization requests funds to conduct an advertising campaign to benefit specialty crop members.

Value Added- Regional Food Systems



 The department received 63 proposals, requesting \$7.8 million in grant funding for the first year of this grant program. MDARD funded 14 of those proposals.



 In 2014, MDARD received 53 proposals requesting more than \$3.4 million in funding.
 13 were funded.
