# **Become a Junior Superintendent!**

Who is eligible? Any 4-Her who is 11+ 4-H age.

#### When do I have duties?

Crafts, Educational: Thursday and Friday prior to Fair AND Monday after Fair

Communications: Thursday and Friday prior to Fair, occasionally during Fair week, AND Monday after Fair

Small Animals, Goats, Large Livestock, Horse: animal check-in and check-out, during the week according to species

Produce/Horticulture: Thursday, Friday, Saturday prior to Fair AND Monday after Fair

Is there an incentive? Each Junior Superintendent will receive a name badge that will allow you to check your static projects in early on Thursday prior to Fair and hop to the front of the line for food and communication projects on Friday. Those who help at any pre-fair events (county shoot, cat show, etc.) or the standard duties listed above, you will be entered into a cash prize drawing. The prize drawing will be held on Monday, August 5th after project check-out. Superintendents will sign off on the member's duty slip once they have completed their duties. Members will then be responsible for submitting the slip to the 4-H Headquarters before the drawing. You do not need to be present to win.





Interested in leading shooting sports with a 4-H club? All 4-H Shooting Sports clubs are supervised by certified 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor. Instructors must become certified in the specific discipline(s) they wish to lead. These disciplines include archery, rifle, shotgun, muzzleloader, hunting and wildlife and pistol. This Regional Training is for Archery only. The training includes skill development, safety, risk management and appropriate ways to share this content with youth. To maintain Instructor status, re-certification is required every 3 years.

#### Michigan 4-H Foundation opens 2019-20 grant cycle

Awarded annually, the Michigan 4-H Foundation recently opened their grant and award opportunities for the 2019-2020 season. Open to 4-H volunteer leaders, members and staff, the grants and awards support local 4-H clubs and county programs, as well as recognize members of the 4-H community. All applications are due June 1.

#### Opportunities include:

- Michigan 4-H Legacy Grants of \$1,000. These grants are awarded to support development of a new program or initiative, or to strengthen, enhance or expand a current program that's making a difference
- The 4-H After-School Robotics Club in Iosco County received a \$1,000 Michigan 4-H Legacy Grant to use VEX Robotics as a tool to help club

members develop life skills.

- 4-H On-Target Grants of \$500. These grants support 4-H Shooting Sports programs to enhance existing programs, develop a new program, or offer a special experience related to 4-H Shooting Sports.
- The Collins 4-H Youth Horticulture Grant of \$350. This grant is available only to 4-H youth clubs and supports advancement of club work in plant science and horticulture activities.
- 4-H Educational Garden Grants of \$1,000. These grants support the creation of local 4-H educational gardens in Michigan.
- Michigan Farm Bureau 4-H Excellence in Agriculture Award (includes \$1,000 grant). This award recognizes the outstanding achievements of 4-H agricultural volunteers.
