

Job Description-Responsibilities and Expectations

PURPOSE: To support the year-round Monroe County 4-H Youth Development of the Dog Program Area. To organize and supervise judging, exhibits, and activities in the 4-H Dog Program at the Monroe County Fair in conjunction with the Monroe County 4-H Small Animal Association, Monroe County 4-H Fair Advisory Board, Monroe County Fair Association, Fair Executive Board and Fair Manager to make the 4-H division a learning experience for all youth.

DESIRED EXPERIENCE, KNOWLEDGE, & SKILLS:

- Be an approved gold 4-H volunteer through the Volunteer Selection Process Abide by the MSU Extension Volunteer Code of Conduct 1.
- 2.
- 3. Have familiarity with the Monroe County 4-H Dog Program
- 4. Ability to work with adults and youth, and on a team
- 5. Demonstrate clear and effective communication
- 6. Ability to organize and supervise
- Flexible and responsive to change for the good of the total program and those who participate

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Use the Small Animal Association as the governing body for all changes in the 4-H fair division.
- 2. Plan and implement 6+ Dog Program meetings per program year
- 3. Be willing to help with clean-up and set-up of project area
- 4. Be available for check-in, judging and check-out of area
- Be responsible for preparing copy and proofreading premium catalog



Dog Superintendent Opening

Responsibilities Cont.

- 1. Identify all assistant superintendents and judges that will work dog area
- 2. Help to identify youth (Junior Superintendents) to assist in dog area
- 3. Be willing to take full responsibility for the records generated from dog area
- 4. Be willing to answer questions which may arise
- 5. Keep open communication with the 4-H Staff
- 6. Attend all meetings, available to hear input from youth and leaders
- 7. Serve as an integral part of problem solving and communication
- 8. Provide input and recommendations for judges for all disciples in dog area
- 9. Help to provide appropriate recognition for all volunteer staff that work in dog area
- 10. Serve as resource person for workshops and county-wide events throughout the year

ATTEND:

- 1. Attend all Dog Program Meetings-approximately 6-12 per year
- 2. Pre-Fair meeting. Go over additions, subtractions and changes in dog area.
- 3. Post-Fair meeting. Answer questions and concerns relating to dog area.
- Annual meeting with Small Animal General Superintendent to discuss needs/wants concerning area on the fairgrounds.
- 5. Superintendent meeting.
- 6. Attend and supervise workshops and Fun Matches

Pre-Fair

- 1. Secure Judges for classes
- 2. Encourage participation to write letters to buyers to attend the auction.
- 3. Work with assistant superintendents to break classes, develop a show

Fair Week

- 1. Fair
 - 1. Superintendent needs to be present during check-in and events.
 - 2. Be available to answer questions from exhibitors, parents, leaders, and 4-H staff.
 - 3. Work with SAA General Superintendent and 4-H Program Coordinator to clarify any discrepancies in eligibility of animals or youth.
 - 4. Support appropriate animal welfare practices.
 - 5. Prior to show, get ribbons, trophies, and judging books from the 4-H Headquarters Office.
 - 6. During show, designate a committee member to perform each of the following duties:
 - 1. Ring Announcer, Check 4-H'ers in, Ring person to help exhibitors, Record placings (also be sure all "no shows" or changes are noted), Return notebook to the 4-H Office promptly following the show, Orient judge on day of show. Be sure judge gets refreshments. At conclusion of show, deliver payment to judges.






