4-H Enthusiast Award: A special award to honor 4-H members for their 4-H enthusiasm. Awarded to members who are 8 years old or older by January 1, 2025, and have just **completed their first year** of "regular" 4-H. Do you love 4-H and enjoy helping with your club's activities? Apply for the 4-H Enthusiast Award.

Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF) (TBA June/July 2026): CWF is a unique citizenship education program utilizing the Nation's Capital as the classroom. Applicant must have an interest in government/citizenship and may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. Number selected may vary each year and interviews may be scheduled. Your 4-H age needs to be 15 by January 1, 2026. 4-H Youth Council will pay for ¾ of the cost, leaving the applicant to pay ~\$500.00 (total cost ~\$2,000.00). Applicants must complete the essay prompt for this award. Limit of two (2) winners per year.

4-H Mark of Excellence Award (June 17-19, 2026 - Exploration Days): 4-H Mark of Excellence Award is an award for 4-H youth between the ages of 10-11 by January 1, 2026. For the St. Joseph County Awards Form, complete an essay focusing on the theme of "4-H Beyond Ready..." All essays must be 200-500 words. Please do not include graphics or pictures in your essay. Two winners may be selected and will represent St. Joseph County at the state Awards Celebration during 4-H Exploration Days. Youth are only eligible to receive this award one time. You MUST complete the application at the county level by January 30 to be eligible, regardless of the State Awards deadline.

4-H Key Club Award: Any 4-H member 15 years old or older by January 1, 2025, is eligible. Members must have completed at least three years of club work, have taken at least two different 4-H projects, served and completed as a teen leader this past 4-H year. Applicants must complete the essay prompt for this award. A 4-H member may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. Limit of two (2) winners per year.
