





## 4-H Club Spotlight! - Chances Are Youth 4-H Club

The mission of the Chances Are Youth 4-H Club is to inspire a passion for equine care, leadership, and lifelong learning by providing hands-on experiences with horses. We aim to foster responsibility, teamwork, and a deep understanding of horsemanship while empowering youth to develop confidence, respect for animals, and skills that will serve them both in and out of the arena.

By joining Chances are Youth 4-H Club members will:

- 1. **Develop Horsemanship Skills**: Teach members the fundamentals of equine care, riding, and handling through hands-on experiences with horses.
- 2. Foster Responsibility: Encourage youth to take responsibility for the health and well-being of horses, including feeding, grooming, and basic veterinary care.
- 3. **Promote Leadership and Teamwork**: Provide opportunities for members to take on leadership roles within the club and work together to achieve common goals.
- **4. Encourage Personal Growth**: Help members build confidence, self-discipline, and resilience by challenging them to set and achieve personal goals related to horsemanship and equine care.
- 5. Teach Safety Around Horses: Instill a strong understanding of safety practices when working with horses, both in and out of the saddle.
- **6. Enhance Communication Skills**: Encourage effective communication with both peers and instructors, as well as learning how to communicate with horses through body language and cues.
- 7. Promote Sportsmanship: Instill values of fairness, respect, and integrity, whether in competitive settings or recreational riding.
- 8. Increase Knowledge of Equine Science: Introduce members to equine anatomy, nutrition, behavior, and health care to deepen their understanding of horse welfare.
- **9. Encourage Community Involvement**: Participate in community service projects, horse shows, and educational events to contribute to the broader community and promote equine awareness.
- **10. Have Fun and Build Lifelong Friendships**: Create a supportive and enjoyable environment where members can bond over their shared love of horses and make lasting friendships.

# Starting the 4-H season off right: Suggestions for the year's first meeting

A new 4-H year has started and that means it is time to start thinking about the goals and plans for educational, inspirational and recreational activities for Michigan 4-H clubs! No matter what project youth are participating in, it is important to start the year off right!



MSU Extension has resources for volunteers to help lead and manage their 4-H club on the 4-H Club Development website, <a href="https://www.canr.msu.edu/4hclub/index">www.canr.msu.edu/4hclub/index</a>. A good start to the 4-H year will allow youth members, club leaders and parents to be clear about expectations and plans for the group and be excited for what will take place. Some tips to get you started include:

- Get to know youth and adults and share about 4-H! Clubs transition from year to year. There may be members new to
  4-H, youth trying new project areas, and members who have left or transitioned to different activities. Make sure everyone
  knows each other with a fun icebreaker activity.
- Prepare a list of activities for the year. The 4-H year goes fast and there is a lot to do in a short period of time. Preparing a list of club activities for meetings is important to ensure youth are learning the life and technical skills of their 4-H project.
- Create a calendar. Once you have your activities picked out, it's time to plan when and where it will all happen!

#### MSU Extension hosts successful second Michigan 4-H Day at the Capitol

On October 9, MSU Extension hosted the second Michigan 4-H Day at the Capitol to showcase the positive impact of the Michigan 4-H program and bring additional visibility to its effects. The event was held in the atrium of Heritage Hall – the Capitol Visitor's Center.

"We were so excited to bring this event back in 2024," said Deanna East, MSU Extension associate director who served as the event emcee. "Michigan 4-H is certainly worth celebrating every day of the year and we are grateful for the opportunity to highlight this impactful program to our state's leaders."

Michigan 4-H Day at the Capitol was attended by legislators, stakeholders and members of the public. At the event, attendees visited information booths
